Exams

Exams for students in grades 7-12 will take place on December 15, 18 and 19. Exams are meant to be a formative assessment to help assess the long term retention of learned material. It is important that students are present for exam days. Students who miss an exam without a medical excuse are subject to academic consequences. The exam schedule will be distributed to students and will be posted on-line and a link will be available in the Sunday enews closer to the date. If a student has a medical emergency, the make up day will be Wednesday, December 20. Students may dress down for the exam days. Students may also leave once their exams are completed each day.

SGO/Scholarship Granting Organization

The state of Ohio has implemented a new tax program which allows you to lower the amount you pay in Ohio Income taxes. If you make a donation to a scholarship granting organization (Saint John qualifies) you will receive a deduction (tax Credit) for the exact amount. Donors may donate \$750:for an individual and \$1500 for a couple filing jointly. If in 2023 your Ohio tax liability is \$2000 and you donate \$750/\$1500 to Saint John your liability is now only \$1250/500. If your tax liability is less than \$750 you may donate a lesser amount. This is a win-win situation for the donor and Saint John. There is no catch.

This is a tentative date for our information night, the Federal Government has decided to postpone opening FAFSA on December 1st. The alternative date for our FAFSA night will be **January 9th at 6pm.** If the Federal Government opens FAFSA in time, we have a December 13th date set aside for our families.

FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA) WORKSHOP FOR SENIOR PARENTS

Senior parent(s) and students are encouraged to attend the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) **interactive workshop** in which you will be completing the FAFSA form online. This will be the only college financial aid workshop scheduled at Saint John. FAFSA information is changing and will not open until **December** this year. If you are a family who has previously filled out FAFSA, the application process is changing. We will do our best to keep you updated on the changes.

To assist in the **completion** of the FAFSA, the following information should be brought to the meeting for the parent and the student....

- 1. Student's social security number
- 2. Parents' social security numbers if parent information will be provided
- 3. Driver's license number (if you have one)
- 4. Alien registration or permanent resident card if not a United States citizen
- 5. Information on savings, investments and business and farm assets for student and parent(s)
- 6. Federal tax information or tax return including (1040, 1040A, 1040EZ) IRS W-2 information for student and parents if providing parent information. **Use the 2022 tax information**.
- 7. Foreign tax return and/or tax return for Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the US Virgin Islands, the Marshall Islands, the Federated States of Micronesia or Palau.
- 8. Records of your untaxed income such as child support received, interest income and veterans' non-education benefits
- 9. Information (parent/student) on cash, savings and checking account balances; investments including stocks and bonds and real estate but not including the home in which you live; business and farm assets.

Prior to that evening we will be working with the seniors to create a FAFSA ID. We are also asking that if both parents are contributing information to the FAFSA for then both parents need to create their own FAFSA ID as this will allow for enough time to hopefully complete the FAFSA on the evening of the 13th. We will continue to keep families updated as we receive information regarding FAFSA.


