## A Note from the President

The time before Christmas can be stressful. There is so much "to do". Elsewhere in the newsletter, you will see that our focus as a school is to take time to pray during Advent. But, as much as we might want to take time to pause, and BE during Advent, we can get lost along the way.

One of my frustration "triggers" is getting lost on the road. Even with voice assist of GPS, at times we can get stuck. Perhaps it is an accident that closes the exit we are meant to take. Or perhaps we entered the street as East 9<sup>th</sup> and it was meant to be West 9<sup>th</sup>. Or we come up on a detour and it's not clear how we should keep going.

Detours are a part of life. Author Regina Brett has just written a book about life's detours. I haven't read it yet, but I am sure it offers insights on how to deal with the unexpected interruptions in our life plans. I think Christmas preparation is full of these types of interruptions. We have our calendar clearly planned out. We are wrapping presents on the 10<sup>th</sup>; making cookies on the 12<sup>th</sup>; mailing our cards on the 13<sup>th</sup>, visiting Aunt Susie on December 19<sup>th</sup> etc. Then in the middle things happen. The only present Johnny wants won't get here until December 30th. Your mother-in-law broke her hip and now you are hosting Christmas Eve. It doesn't matter whether the detour is big or small, it changes our plans. We had everything arranged perfectly, but now the paper has a new design. Often, we can deal with the big detours, it's the last little change that can send us over the edge.

If this is true for us as adults, it is just as true for our students. Christmas for the littlest Heralds is a time of expectation and excitement. For the more "senior" Heralds, it holds a different type of engagement, from exams to picking out an ugly Christmas sweater. I think one of the lessons we can learn together is that sometimes the best part of a trip are the detours we take. Perhaps our Christmas traditions this year might be different this year due to circumstances beyond our control. Can we make new traditions that bring a different type of holiday joy? Are we able to recognize that others in our circle of family and friends may have lost their way and are facing more than a slight detour? Are we able to help them find a new road for the journey?

As we pray our way through Advent, let us take time to BE and not just DO. All of us at Saint John pray that we can BE people of HOPE; we pray that we can BE people who ACT; we pray that we can BE people who allow Christ to come into our lives, the lives of our family and into the lives of strangers who come into our midst. If we focus on who we are and not what we do, we will celebrate the same way Jesus did on the road to Bethlehem.

Advent is a time of prayer and reflection. It invites us to prepare our hearts for the celebration of Christmas. This year, Pope Francis has called for a jubilee year inviting us to Embrace the Gift of Hope.

Praying during Advent can deepen our faith and cultivate our sense of being a member of a faith-filled community.

As we celebrate Advent through Prayer, we remember that prayer is a time for ACTS.

We act by uplifting our hearts in **Adoration**. We recognize that we prepare for the birth of our Saviour, who shepherds and kings knelt before in the humble stable where Jesus was born.

We act by being **Contrite**. We are sorry for the times we have closed our hearts to Jesus by not recognizing Him in those around us.

We act by giving **Thanks**. We are thankful for God sending his only Son to be one with us.

We act by sending up prayers of **Supplication**. We ask God to bless our families, to bless those less fortunate and to bless our world.

As a school, we will pray in Adoration each week with our Advent Prayer services and at the celebration of Mass on December 9th. This Mass will be at 9:45 and all are welcome to join us.

As a school, we will have the opportunity to express contrition through the Sacrament of Reconciliation on December 4 for students in grades 7-12 and on December 11 for students in grades 3-6. Before the celebration of the sacrament, all of us will have the opportunity to examine how we can be more attentive to Christ in our lives.

As a school, we will have the opportunity to express our gratitude in prayer by special prayers in class and at the beginning of the day.

As a school, we will pray for God to bless those less fortunate. Our prayer will be shown in our actions by participating in the Catholic Charities HALO project. More details on this will be in the e-newsletter.



### **Athletic News**


