A Note from the President

It is common to make resolutions for the year – common ones such as losing weight, exercising, taking more time to pray – or specific ones that apply in our own personal lives.

Being responsible is not always exciting. Sometimes we characterize responsible people as boring. One of the saints that we celebrate in the month of January is St. Mariann Cope. Marianne Cope came to the United States from Germany as a young child. After attending Catholic elementary school, she was asked to go to work in a factory to help support her family, as her father had become an invalid. After her Father's death, she was free to pursue her dream of becoming a Catholic sister. She became a Franciscan Sister. Her ministry included teaching, overseeing the education of immigrants and founding the first Catholic hospital in New York.

A request from officials in Haw changed her life. The request was for her to come to care for patients who were sick – they had a disease that was known as leprosy, highly contagious. She and six other sisters went and stayed. She cared for the outcasts and made sure they were treated with kindness and dignity. She was 80 and went about caring for others until the end. No splashy headlines, no extraordinary experiences. She did the ordinary with extraordinary love. That is responsibility.

Responsible for being truthful and honest
Responsible for growing as children of God

As we usher in a new year, let us resolve to be Responsible.

Midterms and Incomplete Grades

Students who have not yet completed their midterms must contact their teachers. They will receive an Incomplete (I) on their report cards until the exams have been completed. Students must schedule makeup exams with their teachers. According to the Handbook: Incomplete Grades if special circumstances exist, e.g., extended illness, a teacher may assign temporarily a grade of "Incomplete" (I) at the end of a half-term or term. A student may make up the necessary work within a time period equal to the number of days absent or two weeks, whichever is shorter. Otherwise the "Incomplete" grade becomes an "F," a failing grade. The administration reserves the right to extend the time allowed for make-up work.

Saint John Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO) Do you pay Ohio income tax? Then, it's time to meet the Saint John SGO. It is like a boomerang...what you give comes back to YOU!

Overview: You can support our SJS students with scholarship assistance, AND in turn, receive a 2024 tax credit when filing your Ohio income tax.

- If you owe income tax, your contribution to the Saint John SGO satisfies your payment to the state and keeps your tax dollars local.
- If you are receiving a refund, your refund will increase by the amount you contribute. In other words, you "get your money back," AND assist Saint John students! Individuals may give up to \$750, or if filing jointly, up to \$1,500 no later than April 15, 2025.


