A Note from the President

Temperatures are beginning to get colder. Most of us have unearthed sweaters or at least light jackets. We might be tempted to watch television with a blanket. This can also lead us to just want to stay inside (perhaps not as much as we are tempted in January and February).

Our core value of Empathy reminds us that we are called to think about others as much as we think about ourselves. As November is also the month we celebrate the importance of gratitude, it is appropriate to think about these together.

Both empathy and gratitude fuel positive interactions and emotions. When combined, they can amplify each other's effects:

- Empathy encourages gratitude: When we empathize with others, we become more aware of the struggles they face, making us appreciate our own blessings. This was a lesson I learned from my mother. When I would complain about someone, she would comment, "be grateful that you don't have to deal with whatever they are facing."
- Gratitude fosters empathy: A mindset of gratitude makes us more likely to recognize the good in others, leading to more empathetic responses to their needs. One of my favorite reminders is "Celebrate What's Right With the World."

Together, these virtues contribute to a healthier, more connected, and compassionate society. Reflecting on them reminds us of the importance of being present in our interactions and appreciating both the emotions of others and the positive aspects of our own lives.

This is something we can pass on to our children/students. These virtues need to be taught, they do not just happen. Let us help them be more empathetic both at home and school. May we model for them habits of empathy and gratitude on a daily basis.

CAMPUS MINISTRY CORNER

On Friday, November 1, we will celebrate the Feast of All Saints with liturgy at 9:45 am. At this liturgy we will remember the "ordinary" saints in our lives – the men and women who have died in this past year. Information on how to submit names for this remembrance will be in the Sunday enews.

The 7th Grade Retreat will be held on Friday, November 8th.

We will celebrate Mass at 7:00 pm the evening of November 14 in remembrance of all connected to our Herald family who have died. We invite all families who have lost a loved one in the past year to join us for this Mass, as many are not able to attend Mass during the day.

Fellowship of Christian Athletes is holding weekly Bible study during junior and senior high lunches. The gatherings take place on Tuesdays. Grades 9-12 meet in Ms. Porter's room and grades 7-8 meet in Mr. D's room.

The Senior Retreat will be held at Calvary Camp on November 15-16. Students will be bused from the school after lunch on Friday and return to the school after lunch on Saturday.

Friday, November 22, the Saint John Community will be having a Thanksgiving Liturgy at 9:45 am in the gym. This is a **Dress Uniform Day** for our students.

Service Hours: A reminder that each 7-12 grade student must have 50% of their service hours completed by December 31st. Students have been schooled in the rules and mechanics of this program and are able to show you their progress on the mobileserve app or website. Please help your student stay on top of this mandated requirement. By December 31, 7-8 grades should have completed 5 hours, grades 9-10 need 7.5 hours, juniors need 10 hours, and seniors require 12.5 hours. FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA) WORKSHOP FOR SENIOR PARENTS

Wednesday, December 4, 2024 at 6:00 pm

Senior parent(s) and students are encouraged to attend the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) interactive workshop in which you will be completing the FAFSA form online. This will be the only college financial aid workshop scheduled at Saint John. FAFSA information is changing and will not open until December this year. If you are a family who has previously filled out FAFSA, the application process is changing. We will do our best to keep you updated on the changes.

To assist in the completion of the FAFSA, the following information should be brought to the meeting

1. Student's social security number

for the parent and the student.

- 2. Parents' social security numbers and email address if parent information will be provided
- 3. Alien registration or permanent resident card if not a United States citizen
- 4. Information on savings, investments, business and farm assets for student and parent(s)
- 5. Federal tax information or tax return including (1040, 1040A, 1040EZ) IRS W-2 information for student and parents if providing parent information. Use the 2023 tax information.
- 6. Foreign tax return and/or tax return for Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the US Virgin Islands, the Marshall Islands, the Federated States of Micronesia or Palau.
- 7. Records of your untaxed income such as child support received, interest income and veterans' non-education benefits
- 8. Information (parent/student) on cash, savings and checking account balances; investments including stocks and bonds and real estate but not including the home in which you live; business and farm assets.

Prior to that evening, we will be working with the seniors to create a FAFSA ID. If parents filed Married Joint federal 2023 tax return we can have only one parent use/create a FAFSA ID before December 4th, as this will allow for enough time to hopefully complete the FAFSA on the evening of the 4th. Parents and students may create their FAFSA ID's prior to December 1st. We will continue to keep families updated as we receive information regarding FAFSA. A FAFSA ID can be created by visiting https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/sign-in/landing. Social security number is needed. Athletic News


This is a reminder that all students playing a sport must complete all required forms through Final Forms.


