## A Note from the President

October ushers in the autumn season, although it officially began on September 22. For those in Northeast Ohio and other places in the Midwest and Northeast it brings vibrant colors, falling leaves, crisp fall evenings and a need to pull out sweaters and jackets. For farmers, October is a time to bring in the remainder of the crops and to give thanks for the bounty of creation. It can be a very peaceful time after the business of summer and before the rush of the holiday season.

On October 4<sup>th</sup> we celebrate the feast of Saint Francis of Assisi. Francis has two prayers attributed to him that are fitting for our reflections on the Beatitudes and leadership qualities. The first prayer is the Canticle of Saint Francis, a hymn of praise for all creation, conveys a vision of the way we are related to the world around us. The second is the Peace Prayer, which calls us to be instruments of God's peace.

Leaders must be able to attune themselves to the world around them; they understand the need to care for all of creation and create a culture of life with concern for all that God has created.

Leaders must also be peacemakers. Blest are the Peacemakers for they shall be called the children of God. God's peace is more than the absence of fighting. God's peace is an inner peace that allows a person to find peace within the midst of conflict and chaos. Peace is not just within our hearts though, it is a call to action, it calls us to stand firm and readies us for the road ahead.

A peacemaker does not just go along with what everyone else is doing just to avoid conflict. A peacemaker does not impose his/her view on others even if that view is grounded in truth. A peacemaker leads others to truth, uses words of healing rather than words of antagonism and belittlement.

We find ourselves in a very divisive time. Peace is needed now more than ever. Frederick Buechner, an author, says, "Generally speaking, if you want to know who you really are, as distinct from who you like to think you are, keep an eye on where your feet take you." Buechner also says that, for Jesus, peace--shalom in Hebrew--was not so much the absence of struggle but the presence of love.

We pray that we think, think of Christ's armor, don His shoes and walk forward in the Love of peace.

We pray: Heavenly Father, thank you for the gift of peace--your shalom, a blessing of fullness and completeness, your desire that all of creation be whole. Help me to be an agent of your peace, to share in word and deed the good news of shalom and so do your will on earth as it is done in heaven. In the name of Jesus, the Prince of Peace, Amen

#### Halloween

#### **Scholarships**

If your child is on either the Ed-Choice or Ed-Choice Expansion Scholarship and they are absent from school, a note upon return is required to excuse the absence. After 3 consecutive days, a doctor note is required. The state only allows 20 unexcused absences. **After 20 unexcused absences, the scholarship will be lost.** 

When you receive your award letter for any state scholarship, please complete, sign and return to school immediately, so the scholarship can be accepted. Failure to do so may cause you to receive a tuition statement or services stopped for your child.

#### **ACE Program**
