A Note from the President

Recently I was talking with someone about apples. I was recalling how my uncle would, from time to time, go to the Farmers' Market in Cleveland and bring us apples. I thought they were the freshest, crispest apples and tasted better than the apples at the local grocery store. Although we sometimes associate pumpkins as the flavor of the fall, for me there is nothing like the smell of a fresh apple pie or enjoying the taste of fresh apple cider.

Images and symbols are important. Apples are often associated with knowledge, wisdom, and education. 
NWEA Testing


September 29th is Priesthood Sunday. Be sure to celebrate your clergy!





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
